

What is the Angel Fund?

The Angel Fund was set up in the Spring of 2013 in conjunction with the North Branch Area Education Foundation (NBAEF) and is not funded or part of ISD 138. The purpose of the Angel Fund is to provide basic and emergency needs of NBAPS students using money raised by the Angel Fund. Money raised by the NBAEF is separate from the Angel Fund. Because the Angel Fund is not a school organization, it must follow the same guidelines set up for any outside group such as Rotary, Lions, Boys Scouts, Girl Scouts, etc.

Who is in charge of the Angel Fund?

A committee of staff members and NBAEF liaisons under the guidance of the NBAEF.

How do I make a referral to the Angel Fund for student needs?

There is a referral form available to staff members. The form should be filled out and returned to the counselor or social worker at each building. The form includes basic information such as student name, grade, name of person referring, and the item requested. It is simple, easy, and private, and that is all that has to be done by the referring person.

What happens after I make a referral?

The school counselor or social worker evaluates the need and will contact the family to get approval for the request. The name of the person making the referral is not shared with the student or family. Once approval is given, a designated shopper is assigned the task of getting the item, returning the item to the counselor or social worker who will give the item to the student. Designated shoppers are reimbursed for the items purchased.

Who is eligible to receive items from the Angel Fund?

Any NBAPS student including students in ECFE and STEP.

What items will the Angel Fund provide?

The Angel Fund will provide clothing, toiletries, school supplies, outerwear, shoes and boots, fees for college testing, school snacks, and a limited amount of food items.

What items are NOT eligible for the Angel Fund?

Household bills, medical bills, credit debt, toys, activity fees, parking fees, gas, ala cart food, digital electronic devices, jewelry, and other similar items will not be supplied by the Angel Fund.

Where does the Angel Fund get their money?

The Angel Fund has received donations from various individuals and businesses and has raised money through special events such as turkey bingo and bunny bingo.

How much money does each building get?

Each school is provided with money based on the number of students they serve. Money is also held in reserve to take care of additional needs.

Who do I contact in my building to get more information?
